DRESS CODE

The Portmore Community College is a tertiary institution that prepares individuals for professional employment. In addition, we are a Ministry of Education Institution and therefore we are expected to adhere to certain codes of conduct and modes of dress. You are therefore being advised to review the dress code outline below and adhere to same once you decide to attend the college.

Nursing Uniform material available for purchase at the nursing department.	Female: Burgundy dress, white apron, white cap, white rubber soled duty shoes, skin tone stocking (compulsory). Male: Burgundy tailored pants, white bush jacket, black or brown shoes
Business and Professional Studies	College Oxford Shirt (yellow, white, blue) and plain black or blue tailored pants or skirt
Pure and Applied Sciences CAPE	College Oxford Shirt (aqua-marine) with plain black or navy blue tailored pants or skirt
Computer Studies	College Oxford Shirt (light blue) with plain black or blue tailored pants or skirt
Continuing Education; CAP & Skills Programmes	College Polo shirt with plain black or blue tailored pants or skirt
Arts and Humanities CAPE	College Oxford Shirt (light purple) with plain black or blue
Social Work	tailored pants or skirt White Bush Jacket with plain black tailored pants or skirts.
Hospitality & Tourism Management	White tailored shirts, Bandana Tie & plain black tailored pants or skirts.

Black or brown shoes are to be worn. High top work boots are not allowed except for Construction Programme

PLEASE NOTE:

- 1. Skirts should be knee length and should not cling revealingly to the body.
- 2. Bright coloured hair (red, purple, silver, green etc.) should not be worn.
- 3. Pants should not cling to legs and thighs. ALL PANTS MUST BE WORN ABOVE THE HIP.
- 4. College shirts should not be adjusted to cling or mold to the body and 'gape' where it is buttoned.
- 5. Hoodies should not be worn over heads while on the compound
- 6. Please ensure that design, fabric, and colours comply with the information above.

EVENING and WEEKEND STUDENTS

Evening and Weekend students are expected to dress appropriately for classes or while they are on the college compound.

The following articles of clothing and modes will not be allowed on the College premises:

- > Merinos
- > Tights
- > Jeggins
- > Flip flops
- > Very Short skirts and shorts (above mid-thigh)
- > Pants worn below the waist
- ➤ Low cut blouse
- > Exposed undergarment
- > See-through garments
- ➤ Hair curlers
- ➤ Shredded pants (jeans)
